QUIZ 3 - ICS 415 Fall 2017

Today we reviewed forms and learned a little how JavaScript interacts with forms.

The following form asks the user how they are feeling. The user can answer happy or sad. The form uses a radio button. If the user clicks Submit without clicking either answer, no answer is transmitted.

The problem with the form is that once you click an answer, you can't un-click it. That's the problem with radio buttons.

1. Modify the form so it uses checkboxes instead, but it functions just like radio buttons, except you can uncheck a checked checkbox. You will accomplish this by adding an onclick event handler to each checkbox.

2. Add an alert that says "thank you for your submission" just before the submission.
